hat a wonderful first month we had at St. Jude's. It is so nice to see so many familiar faces and to meet so many new families. We very quickly got back into our routines. We had some house games, as well as our first bake sale and casual day of the year. Preparation for our International Mindedness Day also began.

For their Unit of Inquiry, Down on the Farm, students in Ms. Bannon's SK class have been learning about the steps

involved in getting food from the farm to their tables. Last week they discussed how wheat is made and the different products we eat from it, such as cereal and bread. On Friday they had so much fun working together mixing all the ingredients necessary for pancakes, and enjoyed eating them with syrup on top!!

In Mrs. Padovan's

JK class they have been busy learning about healthy habits in their current Unit of Inquiry. They are having opportunities to explore healthy and unhealthy foods, personal hygiene, such as oral hygiene, how to stop germs from spreading, and how beneficial exercising can be. In the middle of October, the JKs will visit Chudleigh's Apple Farm, which will tie nicely with their UOI. They also presented their "Me Bag" where they shared some-

thing special about themselves. They practiced their presentation skills, such as talking in front of an audience, staying on topic, using full sentences and a loud voice. The JKs also had fun at our new play area outside, where they now have a pretend kitchen with real pans, utensils and logs.

Ms. Haag's Grade 6s have begun their year inquiring into current electricity for their first inquiry unit. They have learned about atomic structure and tiny

subatomic particles (electrons) that makes up electric current. Students have built simple and parallel circuits and are learning to represent their diagrams using international electric circuit symbols. They have tested materials for their insulating or conducting properties. They have had first-hand experience of the heat and

danger of short circuits and other dangers when working with and using electricity. Come by our classroom to see some of their electrical safety posters for tips on keeping safe around electricity. This month they will begin work on their science fair project – building a car using their knowledge of electric circuits.

There are a number of fun and interesting afterschool programs that students can choose to attend.

Piano (Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday) Offered to students in grades SK-6. Piano is a fun way to encourage and develop your child's musical ability. We have group lessons, semi-private and private lessons for SK-Grade 6. All classes are 30 minutes in duration and are every Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday. Spaces are limited and time slots are given on a first-come basis.

Art & Recycling (Tuesdays)

Action Stars


